We are working hard to support the children back into being social with a whole class of peers again, and learning how to play in the right way at break and lunchtimes.







# Reading at Blackwater



It has been proven, through intensive international academic research, that the greatest indicator of future life success is **children's ability to read for pleasure**.

Therefore at Blackwater we are committed to ensuring that all our children learn to read fluently, with understanding, and are passionate about reading, so that they have the greatest chance of success in the future.

We place a high priority on reading as we believe it is the cornerstone to all learning. We provide opportunities for our children to read across the curriculum and to deepen their knowledge in other subjects by reading non-fiction books.

At Blackwater, we all understand that cognitively there is no reason why a child can't learn to read and to enjoy reading. We also understand that barriers exist for some children. We believe in all of our children, no excuses are made on their behalf. High expectation drives our passion for reading.



From this term, each child will have two reading books to take home.

- 1. The first book will be at your child's ability and they can read this independently.
- 2. The second book is their 'challenge book' in which they have chosen this for enjoyment. It is often more challenging for them so please support them by reading the trickier words with them.

To improve fluency, children should be reading out aloud to an adult four times a week with either book.

We are missing quite a few of our reading books. Please can you have a look to see if there are any at home from last term.

Our wonderful staff will be checking your child's reading record once a week. Our expectations are that your child will read



four times a week to support their reading progress.

We know that life is very busy but it is so important for their learning that they read regularly.

The teachers are really happy to talk to you about this further.
