FASTER BROADBAND FOR OUR AREA

There is money available to improve Broadband speeds in rural areas, taking them up to 100mbs (about 3 times the current speed that most of us can get). We have all found out the importance of broadband speeds in lockdown!

The money is available to help with infrastructure costs, up to £1,500 per household or business registered.

We can get this funding for this area, but ONLY IF enough people register an interest. You are not committing yourself if you register, but we DO need enough people to register for BT to improve our broadband infrastructure.
